POSITION SUMMARY:

This position supports the work of the Y, a leading nonprofit committed to strengthening community through youth development, healthy living and social responsibility. Provides assistance to the Waterski Director to instruct daily classes, assist boating activities and maintain the Waterskiing program.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

- 1. Instruct waterskiing lessons for children ages 8-17 with a focus on skill progression, safety, confidence and fun, in accordance with Camp Jorn guidelines.
- 2. Manage campers, counselors, and skiers from the boat.
- 3. Be a resource to and provide support to the Waterski Program Director.
- 4. Uphold and maintain USA Waterski and ACA standards in regards to aquatic activities.
- 5. Safely pull tubers for afternoon activities while adhering to a timely rotational schedule.
- 6. Assist with safety through regular maintenance checks of equipment, docks and facilities.
- 7. Complete repairs as needed, in partnership with the maintenance department. Ensure fuel levels are maintained and assist with refueling boats.
- 8. Ensure the cleanliness of the Waterski program space through organization and proper storage of equipment.
- 9. Build effective, authentic relationships with campers; helping them connect with each other and to Camp Jorn YMCA.
- 10. Understand and commit to the YMCA core values of caring, honesty, respect, and responsibility.
- 11. Occasional other duties as assigned to support the needs of camp, including but not limited to: Kitchen and dishwashing assistance, general maintenance, camp beautification, cleaning bathrooms, lifequarding, etc.

- 2. Experience safely driving a boat, pulling skiers and tubers. Ability to drive and technically maneuver a variety of boats.
- 3. Be able to demonstrate waterski instructor skills in accordance with Camp Jorn and USA Waterski standards. Waterski instructor certification preferred.
- 4. Specific knowledge of waterskiing, boarding, and tubing.
- 5. The ability to work in outdoor conditions and environments for extended periods of time.
- 6. At least 18 years of age is required.
- 7. Ability to build relationships with campers, parents and staff.
